maintained at all and that virtually no evidence of maintenance between the walkways and under mostly dying trees could be found.

It is also alarmingly difficult, if not outright dangerous, to locate the graves one is looking for underneath thick uncontrolled vegetation.

We have also noted that dozens of trees have been partially stripped of their bark - obviously in order to kill trees to provide dry firewood to layabouts. Countless trees were found already dead or barely surviving.

Rustenburg Herald approached Mr Butler Matlapeng, Communication Specialist of the Rustenburg Municipality to inquire about the municipality's policy with regard to the Donkerhoek Cemetery.

According to Matlapeng, the Rustenburg Municipality is currently busy with the cutting of grass from the northern side up to central areas of the cemetery. Matlapeng confirmed that there is a cleaning programme in place for the Donkerhoek Cemetery and that the programme started in February 2010. "As the programme continues, it will also address the area Rustenburg Herald has pointed out - the graves you have referred to will once again be within easy reach", he said.

"We are fully aware of the problem",

Matlapeng said with regard to the situation of the dying trees. "We even have a budget for our greening programme in the next financial year and we are definitely going to replace most of those trees with bigger ones. However, these trees are dying naturally, either as a result of ageing or other probable causes beyond our control", he said. "We are definitely not deliberately involved in a programme to remove or to do away with these trees", he concluded.

unlikely to be ready for England's expected arrival on June 4. He said the pitch in the Royal Bafokeng Stadium, considered to be the best in the country, is being replicated on the site.
